

Window Bird Feeder

You Will Need: (All materials were obtained at Hobby Lobby)



One or several small clear box frames (3 x 5 or 5 x 7)
depending upon how many you wish to make.

3M Command Strips

I used mini, but I think other sizes will do)



70-80 Inches of REXLACE or String.

(I choose REXLACE because it was plastic.
my thinking was that string may get moldy
if it is left outside, but I think any string
could work and would probably be easier to tie.)



2 Key rings



Scissors



Silicon Suction Cups
(1 per each feeder)

Some sort of measuring device



Directions:



1. Unwrap the frame and take out all inserts.

2. Take out the 3M command strips
be sure to read the instructions
on the back of the package.



3. Place command strip and hook on all
four corners of the picture frame. **Make
sure that the open part of the hook is
face down** (facing the closed part of the
frame)




4. Measure out 2 pieces of REXLACE or string to be about 30-32 inches each.



5. Take one of the key rings and tie the REXLACE
(or string) around it. For the REXLACE I
found a fisher's knot worked the best.



6. Repeat step five for
string #2. It should
look like the picture on
the left when you are
done.





7. Take the first circular key ring and place the string under each hook on one side the frame. I found that wrapping it around each hook once kept it in place much better.



8. Take the other hooked key ring and repeat step 7 for the opposite side of the frame.

9. Hook the rings together.

10. Place upon a section cup and hang, hang on a window and enjoy bird watching from the comfort of your own home!
